What time?	11 am to 4 pm
Where?	Wye Village Hall, Bridge Street, Wye, Ashford, Kent TN25 5EA (ignore any web sites which tell you the post code is TN25 5EU as that is wrong!)

Below are directions from some main routes and we hope these help you to get to the Summer Fayre, as we are looking forward to seeing you and your dogs!

Travelling along the M2:

- At Junction 6, take the A251 exit for Ashford/Faversham
- Turn left onto Ashford Road (A251) and continue along this road, going through one roundabout
- There is a slight left turn onto White Hill. At bottom of White Hill, you will come to crossroads – go straight across into Bramble Lane and continue along this road;
- Turn left onto Bridge Street
- Take 1st left onto Churchfield Way (as Bridge Street is one way street)
- Turn right into Church Street
- Turn right onto Bridge Street, then follow directions on page 2 of this document

Travelling along A28 from Canterbury:

- Follow A253 and A28 to The Street
- Continue on The Street and take Olantigh Road.
- Turn left onto Scotton Street
- Take 1st right onto Upper Bridge Street and continue into Bridge Street, then follow directions on page 2 of this document

Travelling along M20 from Maidstone area:

- Drive along M20 to Willesborough and take exit 10 from M20
- At roundabout, take the 1st exit onto Kennington Road (A2070)
- Turn right onto The Street
- Slight left onto Hinxhill Road
- Turn right at Goodcheap Lane
- Continue onto Oxenturn Road.
- Turn left onto Bridge Street, then following directions below

Once you reach Bridge Street:

Bridge Street is a one way street. When you get onto Bridge Street, proceed along the road and go past Wye Library, Wye Saddlery and The Elves & The Shoe Maker shop.

You will then see the Lady Joanna Thornhill Primary School on your left; keep going slowly and then a short distance on, you will see the Wye Village Hall entrance on your left (this is also the main entrance to the Primary School and Wye Under 5's group).

If you go past the Village Hall and go past the Wye Village Beauty Shop, you have gone too far! As Bridge Street is a one way street, all you need to do is continue to the main junction at the end of Bridge Street and turn right onto Churchfield Way. Follow the road round and it leads onto the High Street. Turn right into Bridge Street (past the Flying Horse Inn) and just follow the road round until you get to the Lady Joanna School again and keep your eyes peeled for the Wye Village Hall entrance on the left.

Car parking will be indicated upon your arrival.
